

The Lottery Logistics - Your grid

- Each round the computer assigns the class a number and then looks at each student and assigns the student to the “first” grid in their rank that is available.
- Once a grid is scheduled, the computer moves on to the next student.
- Students may end up receiving a grid they did not preference
- All students will have a grid

Lottery Choices

Site Assignment

Students are randomized and each student is assigned to one Discipline/Site.

Students are randomized again, and each student is assigned to a second Discipline/Site, this is repeated until all seven disciplines sites are assigned. (seven rounds, as seven disciplines are being assigned)

Note: Clinical Affiliate Rotating Students may be assigned to a Regional Medical Campus for a particular rotation

How to Rank.....

- If you are interested in the Philadelphia area, list all the Phila area sites first in each discipline, rather than a specific discipline.
- If you are interested in staying out of Philadelphia, do the reverse.

Lottery Logistics

- Any unscheduled disciplines will be force-scheduled during a **post-lottery** process
- You should rank **all** sites in *your* order of preference.
- There are always a small number of students assigned to “Various Sites” during the lottery process. As slots become available these students will be assigned.
- Clinical Affiliate Rotating Students may be assigned to a Regional Medical Campus for a particular rotation
